#### H. Report of the Director:

- 1. On November 28, 2023, Governor Mills came to Region III to cut the ribbon for our new Welding shop expansion. As you know, we received almost \$570,000 in funds from the Maine Jobs and Recovery Plan to add more space, welding booths, welders and ventilators to our shop. After the ribbon cutting, Governor Mills toured the school, visiting every program along the way. She talked to students and teachers about their programs and the students' future plans. In all, she spent nearly two hours at our school.
- 2. On Tuesday, December 11, I spoke to a representative from the State about providing Behavioral Threat Assessment training to regional school staff. This is the first step in what I believe is much-needed training in what to do in the event we have another bomb threat or other threatening behavior in our school.

- 3. On December 12, Danielle Despins from the DOE came to Region III to discuss the upcoming Comprehensive School Review that will take place in March. The teachers were given the opportunity to ask questions about the process, their program self-studies, and the seven school standards that will be evaluated when the DOE comes to review us. A piece of good news is that we were told we are far ahead of any other school in our preparations for the process. That gives us a little breathing room as March approaches.
- 4. During the week of 12/11/23, 8<sup>th</sup> graders from MJHS came to Region III to tour our school and see the programs in person. Mrs. Cole from MJHS is a great supporter of Region III and sets these visits up every year. This is a great way to make a strong first impression on 8<sup>th</sup> graders from one of our sending school units early in the school year.
- 5. I have been informed by the DOE that there is some MJRP funding available for equipment. As usual, it is a competitive bidding process. I will be talking to instructors about this in the upcoming weeks to gauge their interest in new equipment purchases.

Mr. Ring informed the Board that an updated version of the Emergency Plan would be presented to them in January.
